#### ANNUAL REPORT ON CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY ACTIVITIES

 A brief outline of the Company's CSR Policy, including overview of projects or programs proposed to be undertaken and a reference to the web-link to the CSR policy and projects of programs.

As a responsible Corporate, National Insurance believes in contributing to the community at large through initiatives which have positive Social, Economic and Environmental impact. Accordingly, our CSR policy has been formulated wherein all activities as enlisted in Schedule VII of the Company's Act are incorporated. As per our Board approved CSR Policy, National Insurance would focus on the following –

- ▶ Education/Literacy Enhancement & Vocational training.
- ▶ Sanitation & drinking water projects including rain water harvesting.
- ▶ Healthcare/Medical Facility.
- ▶ Welfare & Rehabilitation of underprivileged & differently abled persons.
- ▶ Environment Protection.
- ▶ Relief to victims of natural calamities/disasters.
- ▶ Any other area of contemporary importance.

#### Overview of the projects or programs undertaken during the financial year 2018-19:

a. Friends of Tribal Society (FTS)- OTS

The Friends of Tribal Society, registered under the West Bengal Societies Registration Act, headquartered at Kolkata, is working in the field of education, rural development, livelihood, conservation and environment. The Board has approved for renewal of 250 One Teacher Schools (OTS) which provides basic level education upto class III in tribal areas and backward villages, for the upliftment of Tribals in the States of West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand and Kerala.

b. Ramakrishna Mission- Project Gadadhar Abhyudaya Prakalpa- Educational & development programme

The Ramakrishna Mission— a worldwide philanthropic organization founded by Saint Swami Vivekananda for overall welfare of the mankind is headquartered at Belur Math, West Bengal. The Mission runs a project named Gadadhar Abhyudaya Prakalpa (GAP) for providing for holistic development of underprivileged children. It is a composite programme having different activities for physical, mental and intellectual development. The Mission identifies underprivileged children living in cities, slums, streets and interior villages across the country. These children are provided with nutritious food, tooth brush and soap, towels, etc. They are also given two sets of uniforms, school bags, stationery, umbrellas, etc. Apart from academic coaching, they are also given moral education and



taught prayers and meditation. Various physical activities including pranayama and yogasanas are taught for their mental and intellectual development. We have renewed the project for the fourth year and provided financial assistance & support for 15 GAP units.

#### c. Sulabh International

The Sulabh International Social Service Organization is a non-profit voluntary social service organisation registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. It was founded in the year 1970 and is engaged in the field of environmental sanitation, health & hygiene and a host of other sanitation activities for more than four decades.

We have sponsored 10 Toilet cum Bath Complexes in different places across the country.

#### d. Swasth Parivar Ek Prayas

Swasth Parivar Ek Prayas is an NGO registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and also with NITI Aayog, working in the field of health care, education & training, women & youth empowerment, rural development and environment. They had submitted a proposal to build Toilets in backward districts identified by the NITI Aayog. The proposal is for construction of Community Toilets in high footfall areas of backward district towns and Government Girl's Schools.

We have sponsored the construction of 22 toilet blocks in Government Girls Schools in 11 Aspiring Districts.

#### e. Safe drinking water facility in schools in Motihari, Bihar

Patna Regional Office has recommended for drinking water RO equipments with UV purifiers for four schools in Motihari, Bihar. As there is a shortage of clean drinking water and during summers situation gets worse. RO gives high level of purification while the UV purifier are combined with various forms of filtration as UV light can kill bacteria and viruses.

Accordingly, we have sponsored the drinking water RO in four schools of Motihari.

#### f. AIM(All India Movement) for Sewa:

AIM for Seva is an NGO involved in providing value-based education to rural and tribal children across India. The Semmangudi Higher Secondary School in Village Semmangudi was established in the year 1958 by philanthropist Shri S.S. Natesa Iyer. It was taken over by The Swami Dayananda Educational Trust who are an associate of AIM for Seva. They had submitted a proposal for construction of Toilet block for girl students.

We have sponsored construction of one toilet block comprising of 13 toilets for girl students.

# g. THE ROTARY CLUB OF BHUBANESWAR- Proposal for supply of water to village Kalapita

The Rotary Club of Bhubaneshwar was chartered on 11<sup>th</sup> May, 1965 and the Rotary Community Service Projects (RCSP) was created by the Rotary Club, Bhubaneswar to own the assets with the requirements of Rotary International and to undertake the

community service activities of the club. They have proposed a project for supply of water to Kalapita Village in Odisha, to address the issue of water supply and eliminate the problem of open defecation. We have sponsored for the digging of deep bore well system with facilities such as overhead tank, trunk line, and pipelines to each house with two taps (one for drinking water and the other for toilets)

#### h. SUPPLY OF WATER PURIFIERS- Ahmednagar District of Maharashtra

Government of Maharashtra has requested for funding 200 water purifying units in two blocks of the district, as the water, where available is not fit for consumption and where not available arrangements is made through tankers , which needs further filtration and purification for consumption.

Accordingly, we have sponsored 50 water purifier units in 50 Govt. schools in villages.

### i. Jeevoday Education Society Special School for Mentally Handicapped, Nagpur

The Jeevoday Education Society Special School for Mentally Handicapped, Nagpur was started in 1989 under the aegis of a society called Jeevoday Education Society registered under the Bombay Public Trust Act bearing PTR No. F. 9733(N). The teachers at the school work to moulding and shaping the students in pursuit of learning their individual behaviors, understanding their physical nuances, taking social and academic responsibilities and letting out unsullied empathy to unearth them in to new creations. Their motto is to enable the differently intellectual person to become independent and gain recognition in the society.

We have donated six wheel chairs for the students of the school as requested by them.

j. Kerala State - Chief Minister's Distress Relief Fund We have contributed Rupees one crore towards the Kerala floods 2018 relief fund
